In 2009, I also obtained a "C" Certificate from Zorzor Teacher Training Institute in Lofa County, Liberia. I am presently working towards Bachelor of Arts Degree in Mathematics at the Liberia International Christian College.

Greetings to all members and chairpersons of both local board and the USA board for their tireless efforts for providing learning opportunities for Liberian children. Jabez Elementary & Junior High School is one of the many schools in Ganta, Liberia that has a modern school building, modern auditorium, modern latrines facilities,

Electricity, student's library, computer lab for students, agriculture program for students, sewing machines, work grant for needy students, a very big campus for students play and scholarships for talented students. The school also has eight acres of oil palm for a future endowment fund.

Based on the above mentioned facilities and learning opportunities, I classified Jabez Elementary & Junior High School as one of the best schools in Ganta. I envision that in a decade from now, Jabez Elementary & Junior High School will be a full self-sustaining high

Challenges

I also express to both local and the USA boards that there are challenges in the school regardless of the facilities and learning opportunities. The issues of trained and qualified teachers in the areas of the tailoring department, computer lab and senior high instructors if we deem it expedient to elevate the school and meet the challenge. There is a need to train committed teachers who will serve the institution in the areas stipulated above so as to overcome these challenges for improvements and meeting our goals of Jabez Elementary & Junior High School.

The reasons are: most of the tailors in Liberia prefer to work in their shop, earning more money at the end of the month than a school stipend or salary. Training a computer teacher as well as some senior high teachers in major subjects such as Mathe-

matics, Sciences and Language Arts areas will enable Jabez School to have her own committed teachers who will serve the school permanently. Those teachers will develop more passion or commitments to the school. This will give rise to the school in a decade from now.

Finally, let us all strongly and collectively work hard towards the dream of Jabez Elementary & Junior High School for improvements, positive transformations, integrity, Christ connectedness and making Liberia a better place.

Carol is retired, lives just north of Dallas, Texas, has two adult children and four grandchildren.



Grant Applied for

Jabez has applied for a grant of \$5,365 from the Self-Help Fund of the US Embassy. Approval is pending the review process. The request is to provide hand tools, a storage shed, and related expenses for the Jabez palm project. The palm products will generate income that will help support the school, with an ultimate goal of becoming self sustaining. Members of the school, as well as the community, are active in maintaining the palm farm.

Highlights of the U.S. Board Meeting June 2023

1Jabez Board Meeting Summary

The Spring Board meeting gave us the opportunity to welcome a new Board Member Carol Rossetti. She brings a different set of gifts which compliment the gifts of other Board members and will benefit Jabez greatly.

In reviewing the life of Jabez, Rev. Jakes reminded us that over 1000 students have been served at Jabez. Besides that the school's auditorium, which holds 150 people, the well and the Peace Hut all are available and used by the community. What a gift Jabez is to the community!

At the present time the current financial paralyze in Liberia is causing Jabez and its families to struggle to meet tuition and fees. And as would be expected, expenses are up.

The website needs some updating/correcting. Anyone that sees an error or has a problem is asked to tell a Board Member who will bring it back to our next meeting for correction.

A grant proposal from the U.S. Embassy in Monrovia has been finalized and delivered to the Embassy. The grant request is built around the Oil Palm Farm. The grant, a one time gift, will help Jabez become self-sufficient. Self-sufficiency is a goal so important to the work of Jabez. The request is for around \$5000.

The administration has requested that Jabez Bd consider adding grade levels. We know that Ganta is the fastest growing commercial city in Liberia. We also know that in Liberia transportation is a problem so having a school near that serves all children would be a plus. Considering the economic situation this could be difficult. However, we also know that Jabez is serving the community well and that the kids are excited about school and seem committed. The Board will pray, learn and discuss the situation and our part in it.

The Board will meet again in summer. Anyone is welcome and requested to ask questions and give us feedback as well as monies to help us continue our work in Liberia.
